AILET UG 2025 Syllabus

The All India Law Entrance Test (AILET) is designed to assess the aptitude of candidates in key areas required for the legal profession. The test structure reflects a well-rounded approach to testing students on their proficiency in English, Current Affairs, General Knowledge, and most importantly, Logical Reasoning, which forms a significant part of the paper. AILET 2025 Syllabus for English Language and Comprehension

The English Language section assesses a candidate's proficiency in the English language, focusing on reading comprehension, vocabulary, and grammar. The questions in this section are primarily comprehension-based, but also test the candidate's knowledge of:

AILET Logical Reasoning Syllabus 2025
