

TS LAW CET 2025 SYLLABUS

Subject-wise topics Given below are important topics that candidates must read up on for the TS LAW CET general knowledge and mental ability, as well as TS LAW CET aptitude for studying law and current affairs.

General Knowledge and Mental Ability

1. Indian History

- Ancient: Covers early civilizations (Indus Valley), Vedic Age, Mauryan and Gupta Empires, etc.

6. **Odd One Out:** Identifying which element doesn't fit the group pattern.
7. **Analytical Reasoning:** Puzzle-solving involving arrangements, rankings, or constraints.
8. **Blood Relations:** Problems involving family trees (e.g., A is B's father's brother's son).
9. **Direction Sense:** Questions based on movement in different directions (e.g., North, East, etc.).
10. **Distance and Speed-based Problems:** Basic arithmetic involving time, speed, and distance.
11. **Number Sequences:** Identifying mathematical logic in a series of numbers.
12. **Problem Solving and Decision Making:** Real-world scenarios where you must choose the most logical or ethical decision.

Current Affairs

1. **National and International Events:** Political developments, natural disasters, and international agreements.

2. **Politics:** Elections (state/national), political alliances, new policies, government formations.
