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## 1. What is the full form of NATO?

Explanation: NATO stands for the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation, a political and military alliance formed in 1949 for collective defence against aggression.

## 2. Who was the first president of the United States?

Explanation: The first president of the United States was George Washington, who served from 1789 to 1797.

## 3. Which court is responsible for international crimes and war crimes?

Explanation: The International Criminal Court (ICC) is responsible for prosecuting individuals for crimes such as genocide, war crimes, and crimes against humanity.

## 4. Which of the following ranges is not found in Maharashtra?

**15. If January 1st is a Monday in a non-leap year, then what day will January 1st fall on in the next year?**

Explanation: In a non-leap year, there are 365 days, which is equivalent to 52 full weeks and 1 extra day. Therefore, January 1st of the next year will be one day ahead of the current year, meaning if January 1st is a Monday, the next year will start on a Tuesday.

**16. Some deer are cheetahs, and all cheetahs are panthers. What can be concluded from this statement?**

Explanation: From the given syllogism, we can conclude that some deer are panthers because the cheetahs, which are part of the deer category, are also panthers.

**18. Syllogism: Some deer are cheetahs. All cheetahs are panthers.**

Explanation: The conclusion that can be derived from this syllogism is: "Some deer are panthers." This is because all cheetahs (a subset of deer) are panthers, so a part of the deer (the cheetahs) are panthers.

**19. Which number is the odd one out? 121, 144, 169, 225.**

Explanation: 144 is the odd one out. All other numbers (121, 169, 225) are perfect squares of odd numbers ( $11^2$ ,  $13^2$ ,  $15^2$ ), but 144 is the square of 12, an even number

(12<sup>2</sup>).

**20. A cube of 6 cm is cut into smaller cubes of 2 cm. Find the number of smaller cubes.**

**Explanation:** The volume of the original cube is  $6^3 = 216\text{cm}^3$ . The volume of each smaller cube is  $2^3 = 8\text{cm}^3$ . The number of smaller cubes will be  $216/8 = 27$  cubes.

**21. From which country did India adopt the parliamentary form of government?**

**Explanation:** India adopted the **parliamentary form of government** from the **United Kingdom**. The structure and practices of the Indian Parliament are inspired by the British parliamentary system.
