## INTRODUCTION

Office of the Chairman, NEET UG Medical and Dental Admission/Counselling Board, and Principal & Controller, SMS Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur is the authority responsible for conducting Rajasthan MBBS and BDS admission in the state. Based on the scores gained in the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET), the admission will be granted. Aspirants have to register for the admission process by filling the application form where they have to fill in their personal, academic, and all other asked details.

On the basis of registration, the authority will release the merit list for Open, SC, ST, SEBC, EWS and NRI aspirants. Students whose name will be enlisted in the merit list will only be eligible to take part in the document verification session. During the counselling registration process, candidates have to enter their exam details and provide the choices of colleges and courses in which they wish to get admission into. According to the merit position, preferences of colleges, as well as courses and availability of seats, the admission will be granted. Aspirants can go through the Ebook “NEET: Rajasthan State Counselling” to know more details about it.

## ELIGIBILITY

- ❖ Before filling the application form, it is important for aspirants to go through the eligibility criteria to check whether they are eligible or not. Check the basic eligibility criteria below.
- ❖ The aspirants must be citizens of India.
- ❖ The candidate must have completed 17 years of age at the time of admission or will complete 17 years of age on or before 31 December of the year of his/her admission to the first year of the Undergraduate Medical/Dental Course.
- ❖ One must have passed their Class 12 with Physics, Chemistry and Biology individually and should have obtained a minimum aggregate of 50% for the general category. In respect of the candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, or Other Backward Classes (NCL), the minimum marks obtained in Physics, Chemistry, and Biology/Biotechnology are taken together in the qualifying examination shall be 40% marks
- ❖ While PH reserved candidates must secure an aggregate of 40% .
- ❖ Candidates need to secure the minimum cutoff percentile.  
Other Eligibility Criteria:
- ❖ One of the parents of the student must be a resident of the state for 10 years, or the candidate must have studied in Rajasthan for a minimum of five years.
- ❖ In case, applicants cannot fulfill the aforementioned eligibility criteria for admission, they must be a bonafide resident of the state.
- ❖ **Government of Rajasthan Employee:** The candidate is the son or daughter of a serving or retired employee of the Government of Rajasthan.
- ❖ **All India Services Officer:** The candidate is the son or daughter of an officer in the All India Services who has served more than 3 years with the Rajasthan State Government.
- ❖ **Government Undertaking/Corporation Employee:** The candidate is the son or daughter of a permanent employee of a Government Undertaking, Corporation, Improvement Trust, Municipal Body, Council, Panchayat Samiti, or Co-operative body in Rajasthan, who has worked for at least 3 years.

- ❖ **State University or Education Board Employee:** The candidate is the son or daughter of a permanent employee of any State University or Secondary Education Board in Rajasthan, who has worked there for 3 years.
- ❖ **Defense Personnel from Rajasthan:** The candidate is the natural son or daughter of a serving or retired permanent employee of the Indian Defense Forces, and the employee is originally from Rajasthan. A certificate must be provided to confirm the state of origin.
- ❖ **Defense Personnel Posted in Rajasthan:** The candidate is the natural son or daughter of a serving permanent employee of the Indian Defense Forces, and the employee is posted in Rajasthan at the time of application submission.
- ❖ **Para-Military Forces Personnel from Rajasthan:** The candidate is the son or daughter of a serving or retired permanent employee of the Para-Military Forces, and the employee is originally from Rajasthan. A certificate is required to confirm the state of origin.
- ❖ **Para-Military Forces Personnel Posted in Rajasthan:** The candidate is the son or daughter of a serving employee of the Para-Military Forces, and the employee is posted in Rajasthan at the time of application submission.
- ❖ **Judge of Rajasthan High Court:** The candidate is the son or daughter of a Judge of the Rajasthan High Court and submits an affidavit stating they are not availing the benefit in any other state.

Candidates falling under any of the above categories are eligible for all types of seats (Government, Management, or NRI).

#### **Eligibility for NRI Candidates:**

- 1) At least one of the parents of students should be an NRI and shall ordinarily be residing abroad as an NRI; or
- 2) The person who sponsors the student for admission should be a first degree relative of the student (i.e. real Brother / real Sister) and should be ordinarily residing abroad as an NRI; or
- 3) If a student is taken as a ward by some other nearest relative [as mentioned below (i) to (v)] such students also may be considered for admission provided the guardian has bona fide treated the student as a ward.

For this following nearest relative (NRI) of candidate, who should be ordinarily residing abroad as an NRI can only be considered:

- i. Real brother and sister of father i.e. real uncle and real aunt.
- ii. Real brother and sister of mother i.e. real maternal uncle and maternal aunt.
- iii. Father and mother of father i.e. grandfather and grandmother.
- iv. Father and mother of mother i.e. maternal grandfather and maternal grandmother.
- v. First degree-paternal and maternal cousins.

4) All NRI Candidates shall submit a proof being sponsor as NRI/OCI/PIO in the form of certificate issued by the Indian embassy/Ministry of external affairs, Government of India for this purpose. In the absence of that certificate a duly notarized undertaking executed by the sponsor and notarized by the Notary Public of the foreign country where the sponsor resides being submitted by the sponsor, it be treated as sufficient as to the factum of the residence of the sponsor.

5) An affidavit from the sponsor that he/she looks after such students and will sponsor the entire course fee of the candidate.

## APPLICATION FORM

The authorities will release the application form in online mode. During the registration process, aspirants need to enter their personal, academic, NEET and other asked details. The eligible students must fill the application form for every round of counselling. Before filling the application form, candidates have to register themselves using the Rajasthan Single Sign On (SSO).

The process of application form is divided into two parts - Part 1 and Part 2. In the first part of online registration, aspirants have to pay the application fee and register themselves by entering their NEET details and other asked personal details. The registration ID and password will be generated to login for application form part two. In this part, the registered candidates must fill the application form by providing their personal, academic details, uploading of documents and filling of choices. Once the application form is submitted, it is mandatory to take a printout of the application form for future references.

After filling the application form the authority will release the merit list and it will be followed by document verification, choice filling, and seat allotment procedure, respectively. Students can go through the table to have references about the procedure involved in filling the application form below.

### Steps to fill the application form

| Steps                       | Details  |
|-----------------------------|--|
| Registration                | Register by entering personal and Emails details.  |
| Login                       | After successful registration, students have to login by entering their login credentials which will be sent on the registered Email Id. |
| Filing the application form | Then, enter the personal, academic (Class 12 and NEET 2021), contact, and other relevant details   |
| Upload                      | All the documents under the proper specification need to be uploaded   |
| Fee payment                 | The application fee needs to be paid through online mode.  |
| Printout                    | Take two-three printouts of the confirmation page for future purposes.   |

# Security Deposit

## 12. SECURITY AMOUNT (for MBBS/BDS course)

Before choice filling stage, candidates participating for Medical/Dental seats will have to pay refundable security amount as under:

**Rs. 50,000/-** for UR/EWS, SC/ST/ST-STA/OBC/MBC candidates opting for Govt. Seat (MBBS course) in Government Medical Colleges, Govt. Society Medical Colleges, RUHS CMS, ESIC MC and in Geetanjali Medical College Govt. seat (1 seat)

**Rs. 2,00,000/-** for candidate opting for Management Seat (MBBS Course) in Govt. Society Colleges.

**Rs. 5,00,000/-** for candidate opting for NRI Seat (MBBS Course) in Govt. Society Colleges.

**Rs. 5,00,000/- for candidates opting for MBBS Course in Private Medical Colleges**

**Rs. 10,000/- for candidates opting for BDS Course Govt. Dental College (RUHS CDS) or Private Dental Colleges**

[Candidates depositing Rs. 2,00,000/- or 5,00,000/- will automatically be eligible to fill choices for Government Medical / Dental Colleges, Govt. Society Medical Colleges, RUHS CMS, RUHS CDS, ESIC MC and in Geetanjali Medical College Govt. seat (1 seat) and Private Dental College].

## Bond

- ❖ For Government colleges the candidates selected will have to submit a bond of commitment not to leave the course before completion and to serve the State Government for 2 years after completion of the course, amounting to Rs.10 lakhs (Rupees ten lakhs).

- ❖ RUHS College of Dental Sciences (Govt. Dental College)

The candidates selected will have to submit a bond of Rs. 4.0 lakhs (Rupees four lakhs) along with Bank Guarantee of Rs. 1.00 lakh, if the candidate leaves the course before its completion, the Bank Guarantee and Bond will be forfeited by the college.

## COUNSELLING

Aspirants who are included in the merit list are called for the counselling. The authorities will be conducting four rounds of counselling. While filling out the application form for every round, candidates will have to provide their preferences of colleges as well as courses, in which they wish to get admission. Considering the preferences, state rank and seats available, the admission to MBBS and BDS colleges are granted.

Once the seats are allotted, students will have to report at the designated colleges for document verification and completion of the admission process. After the first round is over, the authority will conduct the counselling round two and then round three. In case, if there will be any seats left vacant after the first, second, third round of counselling, then the admission committee will organize the stray round.

It is mandatory to fill fresh choices in each and every round irrespective of whether the candidate was allotted/joined a seat in the previous round or not.

If a round 1 allotted and joined candidate does not fill choices for round 2, then he/she will not be considered for upgradation in round 2 (as per his/her merit) and the seat allotted to him/her in round 1 will be considered retained as such.

If a round 1 / round 2 allotted and joined candidate does not fill choices for round 3, then he/she will not be considered for upgradation in round 3 (as per his/her merit) and the seat allotted to him/her in round 1 / round 2 will be considered retained as such.

Candidates participating in round 2 or round 3 of the counselling may fill the choices also for the virtual vacancies that may arise due to upgradation by a joined candidate of earlier round.

If a candidate joins the allotted seat in any round of counseling, the security amount will be adjusted against their tuition fee for the college.

If the security amount is not used or adjusted, it will be refunded to the bank account from which it was paid after the counseling process is complete.

A candidate who is allotted a seat in Round 1 but does not join will still be eligible for subsequent rounds without losing the security amount.

A candidate who joined in Round 1 but has not been upgraded in Round 2 or does not participate in Round 2 can resign within two days of the Round 2 result declaration without losing the security amount. If not done, the candidate will be treated as having joined Round 2, and the rules for Round 2 will apply.

A candidate who is allotted a seat (whether fresh or upgraded) in Round 2 but does not join will lose their security amount. They can participate in future rounds but must re-register and pay the security amount again.

Candidates who keep their Round 1 seat after two days of the Round 2 result or those who join their Round 2 seat cannot resign (or return original documents) before the last date of admission. Bond conditions will apply in such cases.

Candidates who have joined a seat after Round 2 and wish to participate in Round 3 for upgradation can still do so.

If a candidate is allotted a seat (fresh or upgraded) in Round 3 but does not join, their security amount will be forfeited. They will also not be eligible to participate in the stray vacancy round.

Candidates who have joined a seat after Round 3 cannot participate in the Stray Vacancy round. If a candidate is allotted a seat in the stray vacancy round and does not join, they will be barred from participating in state counseling for the next year, and their security amount will be forfeited. Bond conditions will also apply.

Candidates who join a seat in Round 3 or stray vacancy round, or retain a seat from previous rounds, cannot resign (including returning original documents) before the last admission date, and bond conditions will apply.

The candidates must print and preserve 2 copies of the registration form filled online along with the following documents compulsorily with you:

- PH certificate, if applicable
- WDP / WPP certificates, if applicable
- Bond as per the applicable Proforma

#### Additional documents for candidates applying for NRI seats

If the Sponsor NRI/OCI/PIO is currently residing in India, a proof in the form of certificate issued by the Indian embassy in the concerned Country/Ministry of external affairs, Government of India for this purpose is essential along with undertaking in the prescribed Proforma-3 on non-judicial stamp paper of Rs. 50/- executed by Sponsor NRI/OCI/PIO and duly notarized.

Or

If the Sponsor NRI/OCI/PIO is residing outside India, a duly notarized undertaking in the prescribed Proforma-4 executed by the sponsor and notarized by the Notary Public of the foreign country where the sponsor resides being submitted by the sponsor, it be treated as sufficient as to the factum of the residence of the sponsor.

Father/Mother/Guardian shall also submit an undertaking regarding relationship between Sponsor and candidate in Proforma-5 along with the address of parents and local (Indian) guardian.
